<b>Reasons for being guilty</b> <b>What did they do wrong?</b> <b>What evidence or facts do you have to support it?</b> <b>Prove it!</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>She didn't listen to her Mum</li> <li>She was stupid and didn't take notice of several clues as to her perilous position</li> <li>Told the wolf Granny's address</li> <li>Didn't listen to the woodcutters or her Mum</li> <li>She went the short way despite knowing it was dangerous</li> <li>She should have know about the danger of the woods</li> <li>She couldn't tell the difference between her Granny and the wolf</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>She neglected her daughter as she was often out and left her home alone</li> <li>She didn't tell Red the way to go</li> <li>Too busy to care</li> <li>She could have taken Red and shown some responsibility</li> <li>She rushed off to work and left Red</li> <li>She didn't specifically warn Red of the danger of the woods</li> <li>Child endangerment or child neglect are the only charges that can be brought against her</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>They didn't take responsibility for a child in the dangerous woods</li> <li>They should have detained the wolf</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>He ate her</li> <li>He made a plan to kill</li> <li>Took advantage of her age and Granny's illness</li> <li>Has reasoning ability therefore should be tried as a human</li> <li>Multiple kills</li> <li>Broke in with intent</li> <li>Blood is on his paws</li> <li>He tricked Red gave false information</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>She got sick and needed Red to visit her</li> <li>She didn't lock her door. Not providing a safe place to visit</li> </ul>

<p><b>Reasons for being not guilty.</b></p> <p><b>Why did they do it?</b></p> <p><b>What counter opinion can you suggest?</b></p> <p><b>Give an opposite view point!</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• She is too young to know how to avoid danger</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• She warned Red not to talk to anyone</li> <li>• She was worried about Granny and therefore this clouded her judgement</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• They had work to do and couldn't be expected to take responsibility for someone else's child</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• He was only following his animal instinct to hunt and kill to survive</li> <li>• Can he be charged with murder as an animal?</li> <li>• He needed to eat</li> <li>• He was just in the wrong place at the wrong time and the evidence is circumstantial</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• She had no part in the death as she was sick and didn't even have the time to scream to warn anyone</li> </ul>
